WINTER OUTINGS



Take a walk on the newest section of Bikeway, near Farad. If you haven't seen the great rockery wall that contractor Don Hayes built there in 2016—don't miss it! It is only a 5-10 minute walk downstream from Farad exit.

For a longer outing, start at Floriston (above the river, opposite the residential area) and ride, run or hike 5½ miles downstream to lovely Fleish suspension bridge and back.

(Remember you cannot continue to Verdi now due to TMWA construction.)

Winter is also a good time to explore the Pyramid Reservation and the Mustang-USA Parkway section of the river, where the Nature Conservancy welcomes trail users.
